Our MUGA (Multi Use Games Area) was installed in place of the grass area of Key Stage 2. The astro turf has lines and markings such as a 4 lane running track, football pitch and tennis court, which provides instant access to a range of sports. Keeping this surface maintained leads to a high increase of outdoor PE lessons, enjoyed by all year groups. Improvements, including the added blue area of the playground with its markings for other games such as basketball, means our outdoor facilities are constantly evolving.</p>
