**Breakfast Club will also be operational. A letter with further details will follow next week.**


## **Our very own COVID-19 Hero !**

Aiden Temple, Year 5, has become one of the first patients in the region to be involved in a special COVID 19 research study. Aiden became unwell in December and after admission to hospital with suspected appendicitis he had a routine test which came back positive for COVID-19. During this time staff explained to Aiden and his Mum about the RECOVERY national research trial into different potential treatments for the virus and Aiden agreed to be involved. As part of this, Aiden was randomised to a dose of intravenous immunoglobulin, which is being tested as a possible treatment for children.

After having the treatment Aiden started to pull round and Mum said it made a massive difference.

Alex Ramshaw, the Trust's lead research nurse for the trial, said: "Thanks to Aiden and the many other children across the country who have been a part of this trial, we are learning more and more about this virus. Health outcomes are improving and fewer people are getting really sick as a result."

Well done Aiden ! We are all very proud of you and glad that you are better !

## Superworm Treat
