We hope you can join us for our Welcome Meetings this half term. Please complete the google form that has been sent out via email. For those unable to attend, presentation slides will be available on our website in November.


Birthdays — We continue to celebrate birthdays in school. Please do not send in cakes or sweets in line with poverty proofing measures. Thank you for your understanding and support.

A WINNING DESIGN BY ELLA SMITH

To celebrate the National Cycle Network at the turn of the century, Sustrans commissioned four artists from the four countries of the United Kingdom to design cast iron 'Millennium Mileposts'. Mileposts were created and installed across all the regions, stretching to all corners, some as far north as the Shetland Islands. Over 1,000 Millennium Mileposts were installed around the UK,

For the 20th anniversary of the National Cycle Network Sustrans began the process of giving the mileposts a new lease of life through painting and repositioning and our pupils were asked to submit design ideas for our local milepost.

There were lots of fantastic designs from the children but it was Ella Smith Y3 design that was chosen and painted over the summer. Doesn't it look fantastic? Well Done Ella!



		RESPECT FOR CHILDREN'S VIEWS	SHARING THOUGHTS FREELY

Article 12 – Respect for the views of the child

Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right applies at all times, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Article 13 – Freedom of expression

Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.
