Diary of a Workhouse Child

31st January 1874

Dear Diary,

I am in a gloomy, horrible workhouse. It is hard to see what I am writing because it is misty and really cold. It is the start of winter so people are sneezing. There are icicles outside of the misty, foggy workhouse.

I was woken up at half three in the morning because my friend Jeggerson was getting thirty lashes for trying to escape from the workhouse. That's the worst thing that happened in my lifetime it was really bad.

Breakfast was just a small piece of stale bread and terrible, cold gruel. After that, we were marched to the water pump and there was grunting, cold water. We had to pick oakum from the brown, old rope we had to do that for eleven hours. We should earn money but we don't get the money someone else does it's just not fair!

Finally it was dinner time we had the same as last night. It was just some slimy broth, some turnip some stale, crusty bread and I almost forgot sloppy, rotten, vile gruel. It was so slimy I almost threw up.

I feel really sad that I lost my family at the age of seven. Since then I wish I was never born! But sometimes I like it because my friend Jeggerson is like the brother I never had. I miss my sister Kelly she was always nice to me. How can I live like this?
