Nursery children enjoyed a rainbow picnic this week. They sat on a rainbow, tasted rainbow foods and then sang the rainbow song.






This is such a huge achievement for Max. Not only has he worked hard to get his place, his success and achievement is even more admirable because of him not allowing his health needs to stand in his way.
