Our topic for the first half of this term is Starry Night!

In the Starry Night project, your child will explore the differences between the world at night time compared with daytime, through a range of exciting and creative activities. They will find out about nocturnal animals and how they find food when it is dark. They will find out about people who work at night and the different jobs that people do when we are asleep. They will discuss bedtime routines and the importance of a good night's sleep. They will explore the night sky and find out about the Moon and stars.



Reading and Home Learning in Nursery

Please read and share books at home with your child.

Nursery 'Home Learning' books need to be handed in on a Thursday—your child will receive these on the Friday after their start date.

During the Nursery session, children will visit Nursery Library and choose a book to enjoy at home.

Reading and Home Learning in Reception

Some 'Home Learning' tasks will also be uploaded to SEESAW each Friday.

Each week your child will bring home two reading books. One of these reading books will be matched to their current reading stage. Your child may need some support and encouragement with this book, however should be able to decode and read most sounds and words themselves. The second book is a library book. This book will not be matched to your child's ability. Instead the intention of this book is to encourage reading for pleasure and to give opportunity for your child to spend time sharing a book with an adult.
